SYMBOLS	
A vehicle for cultural meaning	
The arbitrary relationship between a 'signifier' and the 'signified', The	
connection depends on the social convention (general agreement) or habit.	
The connection is neither physical nor logical, it is only because we decide that	
the signifier and the signified are connected.

To study symbols can involve studying:

SYMBOLISM

- Ways to study symbolism:

 Examine a particular symbol and the different meanings that are attached to it in various cultures

 Study the thing, idea, or concept symbolized and the different symbols used for it.


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SYMBOLISM OF THE NATURAL LANDSCAPE

KEY SYMBOLS

Each culture has its 'core' or 'key' symbols; expressed in the public system



SUMMARIZING SYMBOLS

The category of sacred symbols (in the broadest sense)

• includes objects of reverence and/or catalysts of emotion

Serve to compound and synthesize a complex system of ideas under a unitary form.

ELABORATING SYMBOLS

Provide vehicles for sorting out complex and undifferentiated feelings and ideas

- communicable to others
- translatable into orderly action

Accorded central status in the culture on the basis of their capacity to order experience.

ELABORATING SYMBOLS

Root Metaphor

- Valued as a source of categories for conceptualizing the order of the world.

- Ine machine
 symbolizes modern, efficient, mechanized society
 the wheel in Indo-Tibetan cosmology
 symbolizes forms and processes of life, space and time
 cows for the Dinka of Africa
 cattle color influences vocabulary, and division of meat among members—reflects status in society, 'the people are put together as a bull is put together."

ELABORATING SYMBOLS

Key Scenario

- Implies clear-cut modes of action appropriate to the correct and successful living in the culture.
 How success is defined, and given that what are considered the best ways of achieving it.
- Example
- · In the US success = wealth and power
- pulling yourself up by your own bootstrapssingle-minded hard work...

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Communal ceremonies to mark the stages of people's life; tell the person that something important is happening to their status.

Rite of Intensification

Celebrated at points in the yearly cycle

- hope for good crop
- thanksgiving
- Rituals as valued-end states and effective means for achieving them are dramatized for all to see.
 Can include individualized elements of rituals: objects, roles, action sequences insofar as they epitomize the ritual as a whole.

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
